Handel's original melody is heard from the very beginning, creating a majestic processional. It is then played in a minor key, to form an energetic fugue, which leads to a powerful restatement of the original material.



The text "Hosanna, Hosanna, O Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord" is set to a lilting melody, making a welcome fit for a king as Jesus returns to Jerusalem.

The Gospel *Luke 19:28-40*





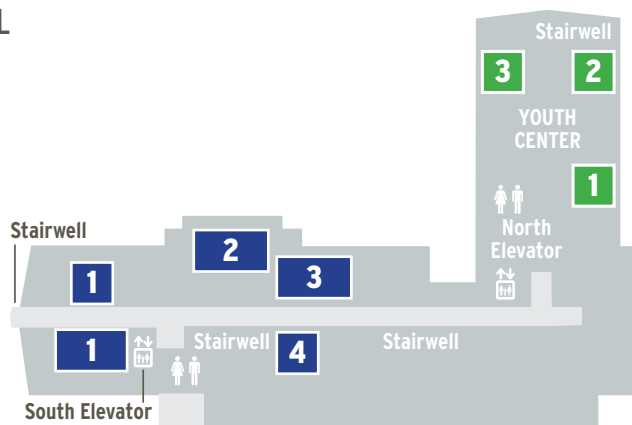
