In total, the WOSM are thrilled to announce that we have now given away over \$11.5 million since the inception of the gifts committee.

In March, Women's History Month, we hosted and celebrated with our neighbors at Jubilee Park and Community Center during the annual Mother/Daughter Tea.

This year has truly been a Bridging of the Divide—young and young at heart, lunches and evenings, wide-ranging conversations and a great deal of fun! It has been my deep honor and privilege to serve God, our church and this truly wonderful group of ladies as your President.

Jeff Rice, her husband Darrel, and their daughter Chandler Winslow, have been long-time and active members at Saint Michael. Jeff's dedication to our church and the WOSM is evident in the many, many people, groups and places she has impacted. In fact, there is not an area of the church unaffected by Jeff's intelligent, kind, and fun touch.

Jeff and Darrel joined Saint Michael in 1997 moving from First Presbyterian Dallas. Jeff had attended a presentation by The Greater Dallas Community of Churches, where she was a board member to Saint Michael Representatives. This meeting resulted in the formation of Jubilee Park and Community Center, and, in Jeff's words, she "was sold!"

At Jubilee Park, Jeff has held every position imaginable—and several multiple times! She has been the Board Chair, served two terms on the Board of Directors, served as Co-Director of the center from 2002–2003, been the Education Committee Chair, served on the Development Committee, Finance Committee and Housing Committee. Jeff has chaired the Jubilee Angel Project, Senior Thanksgiving Luncheon, Senior Christmas Luncheon and Mother/Daughter Tea multiple times. And last, Jeff has tutored at both the OM Roberts School and David's Place Head Start Center. She is truly a Jubilee Angel!

For the Women of Saint Michael, Jeff has been just as present. She is not only a WOSM Past President and Program Chair, but has been Chairmen of the Gifts Committee twice, a Past Auction Chair and a past Vice President.

Additionally, Jeff has and continues to volunteer at the St.
Michael's Woman's Exchange.

And for our church, Jeff has been an integral part of the lay leadership. Jeff was on the search committee which resulted in calling The Rev. Dr. Christopher D. Girata to be the eighth Rector of Saint Michael and All Angels. She was the spearhead and one of the producers of *Michael, The Musical*, was a past Senior Warden, past President of the Saint Michael Foundation, a Co-Director of the office of Mission and Outreach, a Chair of Pathways to Ministry, a past Directress of The Altar Guild and a Mission and Outreach Chair.

Not only has Jeff served our church faithfully, but she has also worked tirelessly in our larger Dallas Community. Jeff is a member of the Board of Governors at the Dallas Woman's Club, is the President and has been Chair of the Board of Craig Class, is a member of the Dallas Garden Club Board, has been President of the Louise B. Besterling Foundation, on the Educational Opportunities Board, has been Chairman of the SMU Executive Library Board and has been a very active member with many leadership roles in the Junior League of Dallas and the Hockaday School Parent's Association.

It is with great pleasure that today we celebrate Jeff's many accomplishments and service to Saint Michael and All Angels and the greater Dallas community.



With decades of experience in the public and private sectors, Kay Bailey Hutchison is a public servant and businesswoman who has served in roles from bank executive to U.S. Senator to most recently, U.S. Ambassador to NATO.

In January 2021, she stepped down from her appointment as U.S. Ambassador to The North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) in Brussels, Belgium, where she managed the 250-person mission. In her service to NATO, she worked to maintain US leadership in the 30-Ally Alliance.

She served as U.S. Senator from Texas from 1993 to 2013. During this time, she was elected by her peers to serve as Chairman of the Republican Policy Committee, the 4th highest ranking Republican leadership position. Committee service included Ranking Member of the Commerce, Science, and Transportation Committee and Chairman of the Military Construction Committee of Appropriations. She also served on the Banking and Armed Services Committees. She was elected for two terms as Chairman of the Board of Visitors of the U.S. Military Academy at West Point.

Between her service as U.S. Ambassador and U.S. Senator, she was a contributor to the CNBC network.

In 1990, she was elected Texas State Treasurer, where she led the fight against a state income tax and put restrictions on state debt to assure long term fiscal responsibility. During her term, President George H. W. Bush appointed her to the U.S. Transportation Infrastructure Advisory Commission, which submitted its report to Congress in 1991.

United States Senator, 1993–2013 United States Ambassador to NATO, 2017–2021



Her business experience between 1978 and 1990 included the role of Senior Vice President and General Counsel of Republic Bank Corporation, the largest bank holding company in Texas at the time.

She was elected for two terms to the Texas House of Representatives, serving from 1972 to 1976, and was appointed, by the President, Vice Chairman of the National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB) in 1976 for a two-year term.

She now serves on the Board of Directors of the Atlantic Council, the NASA Advisory Council, and the Bank of America Global Advisory Board. She is a Senior Adviser at CSIS (Center for Strategic and International Studies) and is a member of the Aspen Strategy Group.

Senator Hutchison has authored three books, including the bestselling American Heroines: The Spirited Women Who Shaped Our Country (2004), Leading Ladies: American Trailblazers (2007) and Unflinching Courage: Pioneering Women Who Shaped Texas (2013).

She is Managing Partner of Bailey Management Partnership, her family business.
